25 Bike Ambulances Sanctioned for remote and difficult terrains

Orders were issued by the Government of Tamil Nadu sanctioning Rs.1.60 crores for introduction of Bike Ambulances in inaccessible hard-to-reach and remote areas. This is aimed to improve healthcare access in tribal, hard-to-reach and remote areas across in the State. underserved This initiative targets timely medical care for communities in rugged regions with limited transportation infrastructure, where conventional ambulance services face challenges.

The new service will deploy 25 specially equipped bike ambulances as feeder units to the existing 108 (1353 nos.) ambulance network. These bikes will bridge last-mile healthcare gaps, providing first-responder emergency services, patient stabilization, and prompt transport to higher-level care.

Service Highlights:

Maternal and Child Health Services: Support for antenatal care, labor, safe delivery transport, and child health check-ups.

Emergency Medical Care:

Equipped for medical and accidental emergencies, enabling rapid transfer to healthcare facilities.

Referral and Connectivity:

Transport from remote areas to access points for conventional ambulances, facilitating further transfer.

The bike ambulances will serve 25 selected remote villages, each equipped with GPS tracking for real-time fleet management and efficient response allocation. These are as follows:-
