Due to the various basic amenities such as housing schemes, road facilities, and drinking water projects being implemented by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. M.K.Stalin, after assuming office, Tamil Nadu is rapidly urbanizing.

An annual allocation of Rs.1,000Crore is made to Corporations, Municipalities and Town Panchayats. Under the Kalaiginar Urban Development Scheme, Rs.5,000Crore has been allocated to Municipalities and Town Panchayats and under the "NamakkuNaame" (Our Own Scheme), with an allocation of Rs.582Crore and public contribution of Rs.183.56Crore, various development works are underway.

Under the Urban Employment Scheme, job identity cards have been provided to 2,04,860 people with an estimated cost of Rs.100 Crore and 12,71,006 man days generated from the financial year 2021-2023.

Under the Solid Waste Management Action Plan, 42,225 individual household latrines (IHHL), 545 public toilets, 614 urinals, 154 micro composting centers and 561 material recovery facilities have been established.

### **Rs.6,655.80Crore in Development Works**

So far, in Municipalities and Corporations, under AMRUT 2.0 446 underground sewage works, drinking water works, park development and water body restoration and improvement works have been completed in 3 phases at an estimated cost of Rs.6,655.80 Crore.

Under the Smart Cities Mission, 11 Corporations have been developed at an estimated cost of Rs.10,639.80Crore.

### **28 New Bus Stands in Corporations and Municipalities**

Under the Infrastructure and Development Fund, 28 new bus stand projects have been approved at a project cost of Rs.968.08Crore, and Trichy, Namakkal Corporations, Sangarankoil, Kulachal, Gudalur(Theni), Melur Bus Stand have been completed and is in use. The works of the remaining 23 bus stands are nearing completion.

Under the Kalaigiar Urban Development Scheme and Capital grant funds, 28 new bus stands and under the Capital Grant Fund, at an estimated cost of Rs.279.92 Crore, out of which 3 busstand works completed and remaining busstand works are in progress

### **Office Buildings for 28 New Municipalities**

Out of 28 newly upgraded municipalities, 27 municipalities were given Rs 58 crore for construction of new office building. Out of which 21 office building construction completed and 6 office building construction are in various stages of progress.

### **Overhead Water Tanks in 7 Municipalities**

Overhead water tanks, commercial complex buildings, community welfare halls and marriage halls are being constructed in Ponneri, Kundrathur, Manamadurai, Madukkarai, Pugalur, Kalakkad and Surandai Municipalities under the Special Fund at an estimated cost of Rs.10.46 Crore.

### **Underground Sewerage Scheme Works in 14 Corporations**

Under the AMRUT 2.0 scheme, underground sewerage scheme works are underway in 14 Corporations at an estimated cost of Rs.3,360.64Crore.

### **LED Lights**

Measures are being taken to install 3,65,555 street lights in the remaining areas of 23 Corporations and 112 Municipalities and 1,11,327 new LED street lights at an estimated cost of Rs.577.28 Crore, and 98 percent of the work has been completed.

### **Rs.194 Crore for 100 Libraries and Knowledge Centers**

The Hon'ble Chief Minister Thiru. M.K. Stalin has approved the construction of 100 libraries and knowledge centers in Corporations, Municipalities and Town Panchayats at an estimated cost of Rs.196.56Crore; in the first phase, 71 libraries and knowledge centers were inaugurated on 5.01.2024.

Currently, 93 libraries and knowledge centers are functioning. The construction works of the remaining 7 centers are in progress.

These centers serve as gateways for students and competitive exam aspirants to enhance their skills, for the public to access intellectual information and to develop their knowledge by instantly knowing local, national, and international events.

### **New Classrooms in Schools**

Works are underway to construct 231 new classrooms in Corporations at a cost of Rs.102.30 Crore and 281 new classrooms in Municipalities at a cost of Rs.118.80 Crore, out of which 176 works have been completed and the remaining works are in progress. Additionally, a total of 905 classrooms in Municipal and Corporation schools have been renovated at an estimated cost of Rs.132.66 Crore.

### **Storm Water Drains**

To prevent flood damage in the suburban Municipalities and Corporations of Chennai, stormwater drainage works with a length of 109.094 km have been completed at an estimated cost of Rs.270.83 Crore.

### **177 New Shelters under the National Urban Livelihoods Mission**

177 new shelters have been constructed and are in use at an estimated cost of Rs.97.70 Crore under the National Urban Livelihoods Mission. Additionally, 4,577 lightweight carts have been provided to street vendors at an estimated cost of Rs.35.28 Crore. Furthermore, 10 market places have been established at an estimated cost of Rs.1.45 Crore and are in public use.

### **Compassionate Ground Appointment**

Compassionate ground appointments have been provided to a total of 1652 heirs: 1,423 heirs of employees who passed away while working in Corporations and Municipalities, 124 heirs in Town Panchayats and 105 heirs of employees in the Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board.

### **Corporation in Public Service**

To ensure that citizens receive all types of urban services at their doorsteps, schemes like 'Municipality in Our Service, Corporation in Public Service' are being implemented. To handle tasks through e-governance in municipal administration, a significant scheme called "Centralized Web-based e-Governance Application" (UTIS – Urban Tree Information System) is being implemented at a cost of Rs.18.31 Crore, and all e-governance services have been brought into practice in 24 Corporations and 134 Municipalities. Tax collection through handheld devices has been introduced in all Corporations and Municipalities and receipts for this are sent as encrypted SMS to the registered mobile number.

### **"MakkaludanMudhalvar" Scheme**

The "MakkaludanMudhalvar" (Chief Minister with the People) scheme is functioning in 24 Corporations and 134 Municipalities; so far, out of 10,283 petitions received in Corporations, 99.97% have been resolved, and out of 34,385 petitions received in Municipalities, 99.91% have been resolved. Under the "MudhalvarinMugavari" (Chief Minister's Address) scheme, out of 46,241 petitions received so far in Corporations, 98.3% have been resolved and out of 85,464 petitions received in Municipalities, 97.40% have been resolved.

### **Directorate of Town Panchayats**

Under the Kalaingar Urban Development Scheme, 2,937 works worth Rs.1,570.84 Crore have been completed in Town Panchayats in four years and under the "NamakkuNaame" scheme, 1,287 works worth Rs.148.37 Crore have been completed in Town Panchayats.

### **Road Works Completed at a Cost of Rs.3057.74Crore**

Through NABARD funds, TARMAT funds, Operation and Maintenance Gap Filling Fund, Tamil Nadu Urban Roads Infrastructure Scheme, Roads Development Scheme and State Finance Commission Scheme, 8065 road works have been completed at an estimated cost of Rs.3057.74 Crore.

Under the 15th Finance Commission Grant Scheme, 213 National Health Mission works are in progress at an estimated cost of Rs.121.30 Crore.

### **Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0**

36,581 individual household latrines, 378 community toilets, 50 public toilets and 185 urinals have been constructed under the Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0

### **Bus Stand Works**

44 bus stand works are in progress under the Kalaingar Urban Development Scheme at an estimated cost of Rs.89.17 Crore.

### **LED Lights - New Libraries**

In 439 Town Panchayats, street lights are being replaced with LED lights at an estimated cost of Rs.155.56 Crore.

New libraries have been established in 168 Town Panchayats at a cost of Rs.36.96 Crore. Under the National Urban Livelihoods Scheme for Street Vendors, pushcarts have been provided to 228 street vendors in Velankanni Town Panchayat at an estimated cost of Rs.1.88 Crore, and shelters are being provided for the urban homeless in 4 Town Panchayats at an estimated cost of Rs.3.73 Crore.

Healthy and hygienic food centers have been established on the streets of Mamallapuram and Velankanni Town Panchayats at an estimated cost of Rs.2 Crore. Under the Housing for All scheme, 14,669 houses are being constructed.

Under the AyothidasaPandithar Housing Development Scheme, 663 works have been completed at an estimated cost of Rs.114.98 Crore.

### **Hon'ble Chief Minister's Awards**

The Hon'ble Chief Minister's Awards were presented to the best-performing Town Panchayats: Karunguzhi, Kanniyakumari, Vikravandi, Alangudi, Cholvandan, Sular, S. Kannanur and Kallidaikurichi. The Keezhvelur Town Panchayat was appreciated with the SwachhSurvekshan Award.

### **Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board**

For the first time in the last 43 years, the Chennai Water Board is supplying an average of 1,000 MLD of water since September 2021.

During the North East monsoon, 73 nos. of Super suckers machines, 191 nos. of jet rodding machines, 45 Jetting cum suction machines and 299 nos of desilting autos were used for the removal of stagnant rain water and relief work was carried out with 2,000 field workers.

## **Water Supply and Underground Sewerage Schemes Inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister**

The Hon'ble Chief Minister Thiru. M.K. Stalin inaugurated the drinking water projects worth Rs.584 Crore and the underground sewerage scheme works & sewage treatment plant works worth Rs.1043 Crore were implemented for the areas added with the Greater Chennai Corporation, including Edayanchavadi, Sadayankuppam, Kadapakkam, Mathur, Jalladiyanpettai, Alandur, Puzhal, Puthagaram, Surapet, Kathirvedu, Valasaravakkam Zone, Alandur Zone, Sholinganallur Zone and OkkiyamThuraipakkam. There are 40.03 lakh people were benefited from these schemes.

Furthermore, the 150 MLD capacity seawater desalination plant and related works on the East Coast Road in Nemmeli, were completed at an estimated cost of Rs.1,516.82 Crore was inaugurated for public use. 9,00,000 people are benefiting from this scheme.

## **Water Supply and Underground Sewerage Schemes Inaugurated by the Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu**

The Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu was inaugurated the water supply scheme of laying of 400 mm diameter dedicated DI water pipeline from OMR Road in Sholinganallur Zone to the 3 ML capacity of underground water tank in the Perumbakkam, Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat Development Board housing colony and providing of underground sewerage facilities to the left out streets in Padavettamman Estate, Sivananda Nagar, M.K.B. Nagar, and AnnaiSathya Nagar areas in Ambattur Zone, etc. Projects implemented at an estimated cost of Rs.431.49 Crore are benefiting 19,94,399 people.

## **Transforming Sanitation Workers into Entrepreneurs**

Under the Noble Scheme of Converting Sanitary Workers to Entrepreneurs, the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu flagged off 100 jetting cum grabbing vehicles to sanitation workers on 06.12.2024, further empowering them to become entrepreneurs.

## **Administrative Approval accorded for the ongoing schemes:**

Government administrative approval has been accorded for the various schemes worth Rs.4,198.91 Crore and the works are in progress. Foundation stones have been laid for the works worth Rs.6,829.26 Crore, and follow-up works are underway.

## **Public Grievance Redressal Work**

Under the "MudhalvarinMugavari" scheme, out of 19,364 petitions received from the public up to 18.3.2025, solutions have been found for 18,131 petitions; action is being taken on the remaining petitions. Under the "MakkaludanMudhalvar" scheme, solutions have been found for 1,173 petitions received and public grievances have been redressed.

## **Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board**

### **Completed Drinking Water Projects**

71 drinking water projects for 4 Corporations, 13 Municipalities, 49 Town Panchayats, and 10,565 rural habitations have been completed at a project cost of Rs.9,011.45 Crore to provide 751.56 million liters per day (MLD) of safe drinking water. 12.137 million people are benefiting from these schemes.

Under the Dravidian Model governance of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. M.K. Stalin, due to such massive projects being implemented, Tamil Nadu is rapidly urbanizing and

stands as the best State in India. It is indeed a daily observable truth that the schemes of the Dravidian Model Government, in creating and delivering the necessary basic amenities to all people living in Tamil Nadu, serve as a guide for other states and are being praised by newspapers and the media.

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
